

**BVD Statuses on APHIS and the movement permissions which apply are as follows:**

APHIS Status	Meaning	What action should be taken?	Are the following movements permitted on APHIS? - farm to farm - farm to market - farm to Export Assembly Centre - moving to slaughterhouses
<b>BVDU</b>	BVD status is unknown – either because it has not been tested or the sample was inadequate.	Sample using a supplementary tissue tag or get your vet to take a blood sample.	<b>No</b> <b>(BVDU slaughter ban will come into effect on 1<sup>st</sup> Sept 2021)</b>
<b>BVDP</b>	Direct positive test result	Isolate and cull the animal ASAP or isolate, retest (get your vet to take a blood sample at least 21 days after the first test) and cull if a further positive result is returned.	<b>No</b> <b>(Voluntary BVDP slaughter ban in place)</b>
<b>BVDI</b>	Direct inconclusive test result	Retest (get your vet to take a blood sample at least 21 days after the first test) the animal ASAP and cull if a positive result is returned.	<b>No</b>
<b>DAMPI</b>	Dam of a BVDP or BVDI calf	Isolate and sample using a supplementary tissue tag or get your vet to take a blood sample. Blood sample is preferable.	<b>No</b>
<b>OFFPI</b>	Offspring of a BVDP dam	Isolate and sample using a supplementary tissue tag or get your vet to take a blood sample. Blood sample is preferable.	<b>No</b>
<b>BVDN</b>	Direct negative test result	No action required, movement permitted.	<b>Yes</b>
<b>INDNEG</b>	Dam of a BVDN calf so can be given indirect negative status	No action required, movement permitted.	<b>Yes</b>

***Veterinary advice is that PI animals should be humanely destroyed as soon as possible after receipt of an initial or re-test positive result.***
