

# CLAIM FORM: BVD PI REMOVAL INCENTIVISATION SCHEME

The BVD PI Removal Incentivisation Scheme aims to reduce the incidence of Bovine Viral Diarrhoea (BVD) in Northern Ireland through encouraging the early removal and disposal of calves that have a positive test result for the BVD virus. Calves eligible for payment are those that meet the eligibility criteria.

The claim form overleaf should be completed by the farm business owner. The information provided on the form will be used in the assessment of the application, for monitoring purposes, detection of fraud and for the evaluation of Scheme effectiveness. DAERA may recover on demand any sum paid in excess of any payment due under the Scheme or where false information has been provided to DAERA or its agent. Any payment due to DAERA will be treated as debt, interest on which may be payable. Overpayments may be deducted from any future DAERA-related grant payable to the applicant.

The information provided in the claim form will be shared between the delivery agent (the Livestock & Meat Commission (LMC), the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs (DAERA) and Animal Health Welfare NI (AHWNI) to prevent fraudulent applications and may also be made available to the EU. AHWNI is the industry-body responsible for the day-to-day administration of the BVD Eradication Scheme in Northern Ireland, and the management of the database on which BVD test results are held.

Guidance on the rules of the BVD PI Removal Incentivisation Scheme, and how to apply, is attached and can also be accessed from the LMC, DAERA and AHWNI websites.
